The Holy Gospel

John 6:51-58

At that time: Jesus said to the crowds of the Jews, "I am the living bread which came down from heaven; if any one eats of this bread, he will live for ever; and the bread which I shall give for the life of the world is my flesh." The Jews then disputed among themselves, saying, "How can this man give us his flesh to eat?" So Jesus said to them, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of man and drink his blood, you have no life in you; he who eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him up at the last day. For my flesh is food indeed, and my blood is drink indeed. He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood abides in me, and I in him. As the living Father sent me, and I live because of the Father, so he who eats me will live because of me. This is the bread which came down from heaven, not such as the fathers ate and died; he who eats this bread will live for ever."

TO THE PARISHIONERS OF SMV

When Archbishop Charles J. Chaput, now of Philadelphia, but formally of Denver, goes to parishes for confirmation he always looks for a girl with lots of rings on her fingers. He calls her forward and asks her the meaning of a particular ring. "She usually responds with either silence or confusion, because it seems like an odd question. It's just a ring – what could it mean?" Then he asks who gave her the ring. The answer is usually a boyfriend or mother. Then the archbishop asks, "But why did your boyfriend or your mother give it to you and not to me?" There is usually an embarrassed answer because the answer is that the boyfriend or parent loves her. Then the archbishop says, "That's exactly what the ring means. A ring given to us as a gift is an outward sign of something we can't see – love. We know love is real... In the same way, the seven sacraments are things we can see - things that have been instituted, or given to us, by Jesus Christ. Through them, He gives us something we *can't* see, which is an embrace of His love."

As you kneel in prayer this morning, looking in adoration to our crucifix, think of the two dimensions of the cross. May we pray that our "vertical," which is our worship, devotion and sacramental life, will be enriched and will be on what we "hang" our "horizontal," which is all of our creativity, outreach and catechesis. On this Solemnity of Corpus Christi, we joyfully celebrate what we *can see*: the real, substantial, life-giving Presence of Jesus, body, soul, blood and divinity in the Blessed Sacrament.

When we are on our knees, may we think of it as a physical demonstration of our love for God and His Son. Then we reverently walk forward and open our mouths or raise our hands as a throne to receive God's real, substantial, life-giving Presence of Jesus, body, soul, blood and divinity. Somehow, in some way we also receive the embrace of His love. And so, we return to our knees in joy and thanksgiving. When we leave Mass, we begin the horizontal tasks – of trying to live like Christ in our everyday tasks. May we be like the presence of Christ to our families and neighbors, both in deed and in prayer – and always in His love.
