Acts 1:15-17, 20a, 20c-26

In those days Peter stood up among the brethren (the company of persons was in all about a hundred and twenty), and said, "Brethren, the scripture had to be fulfilled, which the Holy Spirit spoke beforehand by the mouth of David, concerning Judas who was guide to those who arrested Jesus. For he was numbered among us, and was allotted his share in this ministry. For it is written in the book of Psalms, 'His office let another take.' So one of the men who have accompanied us during all the time that the Lord Jesus went in and out among us, beginning from the baptism of John until the day when he was taken up from us--one of these men must become with us a witness to his resurrection." And they put forward two, Joseph called Barsabbas, who was surnamed Justus, and Matthias. And they prayed and said, "Lord, who knowest the hearts of all men, show which one of these two you have chosen to take the place in this ministry and apostleship from which Judas turned aside, to go to his own place." And they cast lots for them, and the lot fell on Matthias; and he was enrolled with the eleven apostles.

ANOTHER Important Milestone for St. Mary the Virgin

The Parish Council and Pastor would like to announce that this week our parish has purchased one of the houses that border our property.

It is the one at the end of the parking lot with the trees and chain-link fence. This is a cash purchase. We anticipate the church offices will move to the house and in that way free up some valuable space for additional educational and meeting rooms. There are many details yet to be worked out. We have some interior renovation work to do and trees and a fence to clear out, which will give us the possibility for additional parking (yeh!) Work on the fence should start this coming Monday.

In my many years of serving parishes on vestries and councils as a layperson and as priest, I have come to see the wisdom of the old dictum that churches should always buy adjacent property when it becomes available. In mid-April, an alert parishioner noticed the realtor sign in the front yard and right away we started investigating. We have always strived to be a good neighbor to the many properties which surround the parish, and we will continue to be careful and prudent stewards of the bounty which our Lord has given us. Our ability to "spread our wings" is possible through the generosity of all our parishioners and prudential money management.

Many people have helped make this possible in the last month or so, and I would especially like to thank Myron Walker, Ed Lobb, Shirley Nelson and Paul Denning.

Wonderful things are happening here at St. Mary the Virgin. Please offer a prayer of thanksgiving to our Lord and to His Blessed Mother for guiding us in the use of our time, talent and treasure to serve our Lord and God through our faithful witness and growth. Deo gratias.

To the Parishioners of St. Mary the Virgin,

Scripture tells us the Ascension occurred 40 days after Easter, which we celebrated this past Thursday. Pope Leo the Great (391-461), Pope between 440-461, was a renowned scholar and Doctor of the Church. He wrote several sermons about the Ascension of our Lord, and while theological in nature, they are still insightful and timely to the Church in this 21st century. What he wrote, in simple terms is that our faith is increased by the Lord's Ascension.

“Our faith is increased by the Lord’s ascension At Easter, beloved brethren, it was the Lord’s resurrection which was the cause of our joy; our present rejoicing is on account of his ascension into heaven. With all due solemnity we are commemorating that day on which our poor human nature was carried up, in Christ, above all the hosts of heaven, above all the ranks of angels, beyond the highest heavenly powers to the very throne of God the Father.”

How often do we forget that God is very much concerned about each one of us and what we are going through? Remember we are created in God's image; he sent His Son to walk the same earth we walk in fully human form, he listens to our prayers, and by Christ ascending, we know that our destiny can be the same as Christ.

“And so our Redeemer’s visible presence has passed into the sacraments. Our faith is nobler and stronger because sight has been replaced by a doctrine whose authority is accepted by believing hearts, enlightened from on high. This faith was increased by the Lord’s ascension and strengthened by the gift of the Spirit; it would remain unshaken by fetters and imprisonment, exile and hunger, fire and ravening beasts, and the most refined tortures ever devised by brutal persecutors.”

Our faith is a supernatural faith. We believe in things visible and invisible. God's grace is at work in our lives in ways we have not thought of. At the same time, we know we are spiritually nourished by the graces of the Sacraments of the Church. They are indeed the visible presence of our Lord being a part of our lives at every opportunity. At baptism we are made a child of Christ forever. Nothing can take that away from us. The Eucharist spiritually keeps us united and in communion with God. Penance keeps our separations from God brief and temporary. Even when we may suffer for our faith, the supernatural presence of God is with us in prayer.

“Even the blessed apostles, though they had been strengthened by so many miracles and instructed by so much teaching, took fright at the cruel suffering of the Lord’s passion and could not accept his resurrection without hesitation. Yet they made such progress through his ascension that they now found joy in what had terrified them before. They were able to fix their minds on Christ’s divinity as he sat at the right hand of his Father, since what was presented to their bodily eyes no longer hindered them from turning all their attention to the realization that he had not left his Father when he came down to earth, nor had he abandoned his disciples when he ascended into heaven.”

We too, like the apostles, appreciate the teachings of Christ when things go well, but when faced with serious illness, or suffering, we become frightened. Jesus did not abandon us, he is with his Father; the Holy Spirit is our advocate and consoler; and we have the sacraments, including anointing the sick, to help us spiritually when we hurt. Let us rejoice that as we lead lives in holiness, we too may follow our Lord.
