To the Parishioners of St. Mary the Virgin,

“Chick-fil-A’s Creepy Infiltration of New York City.” That was the headline of an article April 13, 2018 (https://www.newyorker.com/culture/annals-of-gastronomy/chick-fil-as-creepy-infiltration-of-new-york-city?mbid=social_twitter) in The New Yorker, a magazine that has changed much since I occasionally read it in the 60’s and 70’s. Then it was iconic, known for fiction, long, long articles, and it took for granted in a self-assuming way, that New York was the center of the universe, and that everyone secretly wanted to live there. Now all is changed. Our country is not what it was 50 or 60 years ago, for better or for ill. Culturally, economically, regionally, morally, philosophically, you name it; it has changed. Along with the how the world treats Christians, Christianity, and specifically, Catholics and the Catholic Church. There is much we could discourse on, and as a human institution the church has not always done well or right, but to a certain degree the state of the church in the US mirrors the state of the country as a whole. Fractious, discordant, everyone going every which way, snarky, mean-spirited, joyless, stubborn; there is less and less that unites us as a country, and consequently that attitude flows into other institutions, such as church or education. Here is quote from the article:

“New York has taken to Chick-fil-A. One of the Manhattan locations estimates that it sells a sandwich every six seconds, and the company has announced plans to open as many as a dozen more storefronts in the city. And yet the brand’s arrival here feels like an infiltration, in no small part because of its pervasive Christian traditionalism. Its headquarters, in Atlanta, are adorned with Bible verses and a statue of Jesus washing a disciple’s feet. Its stores close on Sundays.”

“Pervasive Christian traditionalism.” Really? In a sandwich? I remember some restaurant years ago had a slogan, “Tradition served daily.” I always thought that could be a good description of what we Catholics, especially at St. Mary the Virgin, do every day, we serve God through our reverence and following the traditions of the Church that began with Jesus, Our Lord.

Attitude, discord, vitriol are everywhere, even among Christians. Back in 2010, a Baptist preacher in Pigeon Forge Tennessee promoted and passed out the Jack Chick tract about what they call the “death cookie,” describing the so-called idolatry of Catholics regarding the wafer as Christ’s body in the Eucharist. After the Catholic Bishop and others objected to the promotion of such outright lies, the Baptist decided not to pass out that particular tract, but that he would continue to pass out others. “I will continue to spread the gospel — that’s what I’m called by Christ to do. I’m still going to hand out tracts, but not ‘The Death Cookie.’” Considering all the ecumenical dialogue over the last 40 years, and the common ground among many ecclesial communities (read: protestant) in areas such as societal morals and abortion, the continued existence of cartoon tracts so obviously bigoted toward Catholics in this so-called information age seems so jarring. His gospel message must be rather limited...and limiting.

I have said this before: Make no mistake, the attitude of antipathy in media opposed to the Catholic Church is now and will be the last acceptable prejudice allowed in our country. And even other ‘Christians’ will accuse us. This is the world we live in. But Christians long ago changed the world for the better. And we are now called upon to do it again, and again, and again. We all remember when Chick-fil-a was under assault a few years ago, when we all went from restaurant to restaurant buying sandwiches and standing in line forever. That attitude is what can unite us. I pray *everyone* may drop the snark, the attitude; it sure seems to point to a dark, joyless, manipulative, limiting heart. Let’s follow the Good Shepherd. He has been so good to us. May our hearts reflect our paschal light, our joy, our generosity and thanks to our loving savior.
