Mark 4:26-34

At that time: Jesus said to the crowds, "The kingdom of God is as if a man should scatter seed upon the ground, and should sleep and rise night and day, and the seed should sprout and grow, he knows not how. The earth produces of itself, first the blade, then the ear, then the full grain in the ear. But when the grain is ripe, at once he puts in the sickle, because the harvest has come." And he said, "With what can we compare the kingdom of God, or what parable shall we use for it? It is like a grain of mustard seed, which, when sown upon the ground, is the smallest of all the seeds on earth; yet when it is sown it grows up and becomes the greatest of all shrubs, and puts forth large branches, so that the birds of the air can make nests in its shade." With many such parables he spoke the word to them, as they were able to hear it; he did not speak to them without a parable, but privately to his own disciples he explained everything.

A REMINDER ON HOW TO RECEIVE THE PRECIOUS BODY AND BLOOD

Lately it seems more and more people do not know how to receive the precious body and blood of Christ. There are often visitors and new members and now is a good time to remind everyone of how we are to receive the Eucharist.

Here at St. Mary the Virgin it is our patrimony and it is a centuries-old Catholic tradition to receive the precious body of Christ (the host, made of flour and water) on the tongue. The Ordinariate of the Chair of St. Peter also strongly encourages receiving on the tongue.

To receive please kneel at the altar rail (if you are physically able), and as the priest holds the host and says “the Body of Christ” **please open your mouth and let your tongue rest on your lower lip.** If you have children please instruct them on the proper way to receive the Body of Christ.

To receive the precious blood from the chalice, do not try to take the chalice but you may help guide the chalice to your lips. If you have smaller children who receive, it is helpful to the Eucharistic minister to have the child stand so that the chalice does not bump the altar rail.

All Catholics receive the whole body, soul, blood and divinity of Christ in each species; the precious body (the host) and the precious blood (the chalice). It is **entirely voluntary** to receive the precious blood.

CONFESSIONS ON WEDNESDAY AT ST. MARY THE VIRGIN

The opportunities for the Sacrament of Penance (Confessions) are *before* the Noon Mass on Wednesdays from 11:00 to about 11:50 am and on Saturdays *after* Mass from 10:00 am to 11:00 am.

On Wednesdays both Frs. Kennedy and Dean often hear the confessions after Mass for those who were in line between 11:00 – 11:50 am, but for various reasons did not get a chance to confess. Frs. Kennedy and Dean bend over backwards to try to hear as many confessions as possible. However, people now realize that confessions are often “heard” after Mass and therefore are now arriving after Mass and “getting in line.” Because of this, confessions are now extending later and later into the afternoon.

This is not right, fair or courteous to the priest. We have schedules, visitations and other responsibilities. If you cannot be in line between 11:00 and 11:50 am on Wednesday, you are hereby requested to go to Saturday time for confession (between 10:00 and 11:00 am), or make an appointment with a priest for a private confession, which we will gladly arrange.
